

**Homework Update** - Since the turn of the year we have seen a significant upturn with the number of children completing their homework stickers across all 6 classes. As a reminder the children can gain a sticker on their homework card each week for completing the following criteria:

Year 3 & 4	Year 5 & 6

We will be issuing a personal update letter at the end of term, so that you can see how your child is progressing with this. Home learning, which involves reading, spelling and times tables, is always more effective with parent engagement (no matter how old they get!) and we would like to offer our thanks for the efforts of everyone involved. If a lack of device is a barrier we still have a small number of older devices that we can loan out for the purposes of completing homework.

**Yr6 SATS Support** - We are in the process of sourcing packs of revision material to support our Year 6 children sitting their SATS in May. These CGP books already offer great value, we will be subsidising the books to help families with cost of living pressures. These booklets will be used for Year 6 homework tasks and some of our children will also be invited to join weekly English and Maths Booster sessions that will start after half term. Our ethos in approaching the SATs in May is simply to carry on giving your all in class. Very quickly, the children understand that these are checks to very familiar content in our curriculum and our aim is never to add to unnecessary pressure. Instead we aim to support individual children in preparing the best way they can for these tests. Our focus on SATS comes later in the year than other schools, but we feel that we find a healthy balance in the past and are extremely proud of the previous Yr6 pupils who worked so efficiently in school to produce results significantly above national average. Further information will come out in the coming weeks regarding books and booster sessions. Parents evening is coming up on 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> March but if anybody would like any further info in the meantime, please do not hesitate to ask.
