Easter Fayre Update – Many thanks to the St James' community for your fantastic support during our Easter Fayre. We were grateful of a dry and sunny day (if not a little cold) but it was great to see so many families visiting the stalls and taking a much-needed break in our Easter Café. All in all we managed to raise a profit of £1050 and 50% of this money will be donated to Barnardo's Emergency Fund that works in supporting children fleeing the Ukraine crisis. The remaining 50% will be used to support resources in school, with our Class Ambassadors deciding on the focus whether it be reading books, art materials or science equipment. Thank you not just for the families who spent money on the day but for the impressive stock we were able to accumulate during our 3 non-uniform days. On Wednesday morning we held a special Celebration Assembly to announce the prize and raffle winners. The winners of the decorate an egg competition were also presented. The standard is really high every year for this, but I have to say that there was some 'cracking' entries this year and no 'yolk' it really was such a difficult decision due to all entries being truly 'egg-celent'. <u>Waste Watchers</u> – Our brilliant Class Ambassadors fulfilled their termly post and agreed to focus on the issue of Waste. In addition to a brilliant assembly that they performed to our students, particularly focussing on food waste and waste caused by old and unused electronic gadgets; they also decided to host their own stall on the Easter Fayre. You may have noticed Mr King and the group selling 2nd hand toys, DVDs, games and clothing. Altogether the stall raised £201.80 which will be donated to an agreed local charity. We think the ambassadors have done a brilliant job this term and we look forward to announcing the newly elected group who will be class ambassadors for the summer term.

<u>Punctuality</u> – This term we have made a tweak to our timetable meaning that children are moving to classrooms to start their studies earlier. It would be helpful if as many families as possible could *order their school meals at home* using SchoolMoney, this will assist teachers to register children quickly before moving to groups.

It is also essential that children are punctual for school. Our school day officially starts at 8:45am with registers closing at 8:55am. School gates will now close at 8:55am as this is the cut off for lessons starting. Children arriving later than this point will be officially registered as late which could impact attendance figures. <u>Uniform/PE Kit</u> – I would also like to use the start of the term to address some worries regarding school uniform. Can I ask that girls particularly do not come to school wearing leggings or additional jewellery to what is allowed (studded earrings). If I could also ask that footwear is appropriate with black shoes/trainers only. If children have outgrown footwear, meaning that you have to deviate from this, please see me or your child's class teacher. Lastly, this year we introduced our new school PE kit which is a huge improvement on our previous white T-shirts. Could I please insist that only the official tops and shorts are worn, as we saw a number of children wearing their own sport shirts and shorts last term and if leggings are worn (on PE days only) that they are plain and unpatterned in either black or Navy. Thank you.

<u>Street Tag</u> – Having joined this competition late last term, we managed to climb up the table moving up to 16th place. The leaderboard has now been reset and we begin with a fresh start against other schools for the next 3 months. Our team has grown to 31 'Street taggers' but it would be great to increase our numbers so to help with our efforts. This is open to all children, parents and wider families who want to join our street tag numbers. Simply download the app on your smart phone, capture the QR code and you automatically join our numbers. Once you've synched up your step tracker, most smart phones now have this, it will count your steps and off you go!
