School Notices & Reminders—

<u>Parking -</u> We continue to experience high-volumes of traffic and problems with parking around school.

This is noticeably increased during rainy mornings. As mentioned previously I am sympathetic to lack of parking around our school site but I must remind parents that I have a duty of care to ensure the perimeter of the school is kept safe for children to enter & exit the site. This area has been clearly marked by bollards to ensure the safety of the students and ask that these areas are kept free from traffic. This includes James Pitt Rd, the side street to the school. Thank you all for your understanding.

<u>Nails/Uniform</u> – Standards in school uniform continue to improve, thank you to parents in ensuring children are well equipped for PE days. However we have recently seen an increase with girls wearing long and coloured nails. These can hinder children's written work and hinder the ability to use computers/iPads in class. In addition they pose a health and safety risk during PE and playtimes. We ask that no children return from half-term with long or coloured nails.

Again. thank you for your cooperation.

<u>Year 5 & 6 Space Day –</u> The children are looking forward to their involvement in our end of topic space day next Friday. This has been a really enjoyable event when we last hosted it 2 years ago. There is no huge expectation for costumes and we can offer a chance for staff to add some simple face paints to create spotty aliens for those children without a costume.

Awesome Me – Attached is a flyer for a taster session on a project called Awesome Me. This is run by the Local Authority and will be hosted in our school. Its main aim for parents/families and children to work together on a collaborative project to help boost self-esteem and celebrate the individuality and awesomeness of our children. Following the taster day, there is scope for us to introduce a 5-week block of Awesome Me, so if you are a parent who thinks it would be great for you and your child to work together on this project, please give it a go!

Swimming Sessions — Information has been sent home this week informing parents of Derwentwater class (Mr Carruthers), of their swimming block after half term. As a school we have always seen the importance for every year group/every child to be part of the swimming blocks. The intensive week long sessions were something introduced by Cumbria County Council schools, and the feedback from our school and others is that it increased the confidence and swimming abilities for all children involved compared with the old, once per week method. We do ask for a parental contribution to assist in transport to the swimming baths and this helps offset the significant cost to the school to facilitate this for every child.

Drumming/Percussion Club – This will be continuing through to Christmas with Year 3 children who

had declared an interest being invited to join after half term. For those who declared interest, or for those children who now think they would like to join (in any year group), please contact the office. The cost of the club is £4 per session, payable via SchoolMoney. Parents/Families of existing members will be invited into the hall on Wednesday to see and hear a glimpse of some of the beats the children have been learning over the past 4 weeks. Myself and Andy, the percussion teacher, are shaping some ideas for something later on in the year where the club can play for a larger audience. Watch this space.
